SAGINAW TOWNSHIP, MI

— The A&D Charitable Foundation is building a 20,000-square-foot all-inclusive elder care facility in Saginaw Township.

A ground-breaking ceremony for the new Great Lakes PACE took place at 3200 Fashion Square at noon Friday, April 25. PACE stands for Programs of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly.

The "PACE model is an alternative to nursing home living, enabling the frail elderly to age in place in their homes and community," a news release announcing the ground breaking stated.

Services include pharmacy, lab, physical and occupational therapy facilities, meals, multipurpose rooms and transportation.

"This is a program that specifically targets people who are 55 and older, who meet the state of Michigan's nursing home criteria, but they choose to reside in the community as opposed to residing in a nursing home," said David Benjamin, a registered nurse and nurse practitioner who will be program director.

"Construction will hopefully be completed by the end of November," he said.

Once operational, Great Lakes PACE will have the capacity to serve 225 people and hire 60 direct employees, the release states.

The center primarily will serve residents of Saginaw, Bay and Midland counties, and transportation will be available.

During business hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, patients can come in to see their primary care doctor, to receive physical therapy, or to talk to a social worker, among other things, said Ursula Steckert, community liaison for A&D Home Health Care Inc.

In-home care also will be offered.

"Folks can live in their owns and live the life that they would like," she said.

Dr. Michael Argyle is the future medical director of the facility. Patients are expected to begin enrolling in the spring of 2015.

"This is going to be neatest thing since sliced bread," said Roselyn Argyle, chairwoman and founder of the A&D Charitable Foundation. "This will impact our community in so many positive ways. I'm so proud to be involved in this project.

"We're projecting 60 to 70 positions, many of which will be for ... registered nurses, social workers, physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech therapists, recreational therapists, pharmacists, physicians."

Argyle said they'll begin hiring sometime in the next year, after the facility is built.

PACE programs also exist elsewhere in the country and across the state, including in Muskegon, Kalamazoo, Detroit and Grand Rapids. There's also a PACE program under development in Genesee County.
